Mayor William Peloquin called the meeting to order. Council members present were: Hope Niehausmyer, John Fletcher, John Harbal, and Nicholas Wohn. Zoning Committee members present were, John Werner, and Raymond Schell. The Clerk-Treasurer, Helen Coleman, was also present.

After much discussion the Planning Board recommended that Council go ahead with plans to rezone the 15 acres in the Cherry Street area as R-3. Full details will be published as required by law and another meeting will be held on March 16, 1979, at 7:30 P.M. in the Council chambers.

Mayor Peloquin announced the resignation of Craig Emahiser as a member of the Police Department. Craig's last day will be February 24, 1979. He is accepting a position with the Ottawa County Sheriff's Department.

Two bills were presented, one for the sewer on Second Street between Washington and Main Street and the other for a sewer on Second Street by the church. It was decided to pay for these projects out of Federal Revenue Sharing funds. A portion of this bill is to be paid by Our Lady of Lourdes Church. Clerk-Treasurer, Helen Coleman, will bill the church for their share.

Mayor William Peloquin presented the name of Michael Padgett as a member of the Recreation Board. Nicholas Wohn moved to accept the mayor's recommendation. The motion was seconded by John Harbal. Roll call vote: Hope Niehausmyer, Yea; John Fletcher, Yea, John Harbal, Yea; Nicholas Wohn, Yea. Four (4) Yeas, no (0) Nays, and 529 (2) Absent. The motion passed.

Although Joseph Verkin's resignation has not formally been presented to Council, Mayor Peloquin asked Council to give some thought to a replacement for him.

Hope Niehausmyer presented a proposed pay change. No action was taken.

John Fletcher moved to adjourn at 10:30 P.M.
