Mayor Niehausmyer opened the meeting with the Pledge to the Flag. Cleri-Treasurer, Helen Coleman, called the Roll for Council and the Board of Public Affairs. Tom Boehler, Present; John Harbal, Present; Gladys Donley, Present; Don Spurgeon, Present; John Wyse, Present; John Fletcher, Present. Robert Race, Present; Gerald Chambers, Present; Albert Feyes, Absent. Six (6) Council Members present, two (2) BPA Members present.

Mayor Niehausmyer asked for comments on wages. After discussion it was decided that the BPA would come back to Council with suggestions.

The location of the gas tanks was discussed. John Harbal met with the Fire Department on this subject. The Fire Department would like to put the tanks at the side of the old Town Hall. Donald Spurgeon told about different firemen who really don't care where they are put. He feels it would be an eye sore if they are place there.

John Fletcher moved that we consider other business, seconded by Donald Spurgeon. Roll call vote: John Fletcher, Yea; John Wyse, Yea; Donald Spurgeon, Yea; Gladys Donley, Yea; John Harbal, Yea; Tom Boehler, Yea. Six (6) Yeas, no (0) Nays, the motion passed.

John Fletcher moved to limit discussions to fifteen (15) minutes. The motion was seconded by Tom Boehler. Roll call vote: John Fletcher, Yea; John Wyse, Nay; Donald Spurgeon, Yea; Tom Boehler, Yea; John Harbal, Nay; Gladys Donley, Nay. Three (3) Yeas, three (3) Nays, Mayor Niehausmyer broke the tie by voting Yea. All discussions will be limited to fifteen (15) minutes.

There was discussion about the Police Department. The question was raised as to an Auxilliary Patrolman carrying a weapon. The patrolmen in question is qualified as a police officer, to carry a weapon. It was stated that an Auxilliary Patrolman cannot carry a weapon. Gladys Donley asked why Terry Bartel was still working, and why Patrolman Bertalino has been seen in uniform and patrolling. The Mayor expressed her desire to have a meeting and all claims be discussed.

John Fletcher moved to adjourn, seconded by Donald Spurgeon. Roll call vote: Donald Spurgeon, Yea; John Wyse, Yea; John Fletcher, Yea; Gladys Donley, Yea; John Harbal, Yea; Tom Boehler, Yea. Six (6) Yeas, no (0) Nays, the motion passed and the meeting was adjourned at 10:50.
