Mayor Niehausmyer opened the meeting with the Pledge to the Flag. Clerk-Treasurer, Helen Coleman, called the Roll: Gladys Donley, Present; John Harbal, Present; Mike Despones, Present; Barry Morrison, Present; John Wyse, Present; Bill Peloquin, Present. Six (6) Members present, no (0) members absent.

It was announced that there will be a public meeting on November 8, 1982. This will be a combined meeting with the Council, Water Committee and the County Commissioners.

It was requested that the heads of the departments have their budget requests in by December 1, 1982.

Chief Gary Truman announced to the Council that the Police Explorers have donated a total of 846 hours to the department and Village for the third quarter of this year.

The Village has received only one bid for the Cherry Street repaving project. This bid was from the H. W. Bergman Contractors. John Harbal moved to accept Henry W. Bergman's bid to resurface Cherry Street from Packer Creek to 9th Street, with 404 asphalt, at a cost of \$2,800.00. The motion was seconded by Barry Morrison. Dennis Parks, and Police Cadet Mike Benadum; Clay Township Police Department - Chief Craig Emahiser, Ptl. Donna Baker; Ottawa County Sheriff's Deputies - Tom Foust, Garry Gregg, and John Weidner; Sgt. Al Vargo of the Ohio State Patrol; and the following Genoa Volunteer Firemen - Chief James Purney, Asst. Chief Mike Best, Firemen Mike Albright, John Barto, Lt. Kevin Cornell, Bob Fletcher, Joseph Fletcher, Ken Harsanje, Randy Miller, Bill Skilliter, and Jim Slovak. These certificates were presented for the co-operation and assistance the above mentioned gave during the investigation and apprehension of Jack Gall.
