Mayor Niehausmyer opened the meeting with the Pledge to the Flag. Clerk-Treasurer, Helen Coleman, called the Roll: Barry Morrison, Present; John Wyse, Present; Bill Peloquin, Present; Gladys Donley, Present; John Harbal, Present; Mike Despones, Present. Village Administrator, Clarence Muggy was also present.

Gladys Donley moved to dispense with the reading of the minutes of the previous meeting, seconded by John Wyse. Roll call vote: Mike Despones, Yea; John Harbal, Yea; Gladys Donley, Yea; Bill Peloquin, Yea; John Wyse, Yea; Barry Morrison, Yea. Six (6) Yeas, no (0) Nays, the motion passed.

Village Solicitor, Robt. Pollex presented Resolution No. 16-83, (access to the nursing home) for discussion. After discussion, Gladys Donley presented Resolution No. 16-83 for the first reading.

John Harbal presented Ordinance No. 17-83 for the first reading.

Gladys Donley presented Ordinance No. 18-83 for the first reading.

Barry Morrison presented Ordinance No. 14-83 for the third reading. Barry Morrison moved to pass Ordinance No. 14-83, seconded by John Wyse. Roll call vote: Barry Morrison, Yea; John Wyse, Yea; Bill Peloquin, Nay; Gladys Donley, Nay; John Harbal, Nay; Michael Despones, Yea. There being a tie vote, the Mayor was called upon to break the tie. The Mayor voted Yea, breaking the tie and passing the ordinance with a four (4) Yeas, three (3) Nays, vote.

Rob Alt, Park Director, presented Council with the following names and positions for employment at the park for the 1983 season. These people have already been recommended by the Park Board. Mark Murtaugh, Pool Manager, at a wage of \$600.00/month. Jane Murtaugh, Lifeguard, Tim Nissen, Lifeguard; Rob Radar, Bob Allgier, and Mike Kozak, all lifeguards. Terry Potridge, lifeguard (part-time) and Todd Dauterman will be teaching swimming lessons. Jim Witt and Andy Szycka will be working as maintenance workers. Barry Morrison moved to accept the Park Board's recommendation for hiring these employees and also the purchase of sand, seconded by John Harbal. Roll call vote: John Harbal, Yea; John Wyse, Yea; Barry Morrison, Yea; Bill Peloquin, Yea; Mike Despones, Yea; Gladys Donley, Yea. Six (6) Yeas, no (0) Nays, the motion passed.

Roll call vote: Bill Peloquin, Yea; Gladys Donley, Yea; John Harbal, Yea; John Wyse, Yea; Mike Despones, Yea; Barry Morrison, Yea. Six (6) Yeas, no (0) Nays, the motion passed.

Gladys Donley moved to make the Electric deposit fund a NOW Account, and

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pay to the depositor 5½% intrest, the same as pass book savings accounts pay, as of April 1, 1983, seconded by John Wyse. Roll call vote: John Wyse, Yea; John Harbal, Yea; Barry Morrison, Yea; Bill Peloquin, Yea; Gladys Donley, Yea; Mike Despones, Yea. Six (6) Yeas, no (0) Nays, the motion passed.

It was announced that cheese and butter will be given away on Saturday, May 14, 1983, at the Municipal Building, from 2-5 P.M.

The Finance Committee - Payroll Ordinance next meeting.

Police Chief, Garry Truman, announced that the week of May 15th is National Police Memorial week. The Police Department is planning an Open House on Sunday, May 15th. On Tuesday and Wednesday a Drug Safety Program is planned in the schools.

Utilities - Water Meeting May 19, 1983, Citizens Committee to be invited.

The bell tower clock is in need of attention.

Zoning Committee - Sylvia Essman is now Chairman of this committee. It was decided that a flat rate should be paid to the new Zoning Inspector. Mike Gentry would like a sign for his business 4'X'8'. This will require a variencie. The sign for Vogel's IGA has been ok'd by the Committee. Everett Suydam would be willing to take the position of Zoning Inspector for \$100.00/mo. Clarence Muggy has been serving temporarily as the zoning inspector .
