

## RECORD OF PROCEEDINGS

Minutes of Regular Council

Meeting

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National Graphics Corp., Cols., O. Form No. 1097

Held Council Chambers 7:30 P.M. October 17 1983

Due to the absence of Mayor Niehausmyer, Council President John Harbal opened the meeting with the Pledge to the Flag.

Clerk-Treasurer, Helen Coleman, called the Roll: Mike Despones, Present; John Harbal, Present; Gladys Donley, Present; Bill Peloquin, Present; John Wyse, Present; Barry Morrison, Absent. Five (5) members present, one (1) member absent.

Gladys Donley moved to dispense with the reading of the minutes of the previous meeting, seconded by John Wyse. Roll call vote: Barry Morrison, Absent; John Wyse, Yea; Bill Peloquin, Yea; Gladys Donley, Yea; John Harbal, Yea; Mike Despones, Yea. Five (5) Yeas, no (0) Nays, one (1) Absent. The motion passed.

Steven Cottrell, Attorney for M.C Hesselbart, was present at Council to discuss the extension of Cherry Street.

John Wyse moved to adjourn to executive session, seconded by Gladys Donley. Roll call vote: John Harbal, Yea; John Wyse, Yea; Barry Morrison, Absent; Mike Despones, Yea; Gladys Donley, Yea; Bill Peloquin, Yea. Five (5) Yeas, no (0) Nays, one (1) Absent. The motion passed and Council adjourned to Executive Session.

The Regular Council Meeting was called back in session at 8:15 P.M.

The decision pertaining to whether the Village would have door to door trick-or-treating was discussed. Several residents were present to voice their opinion as to whether trick-or-treat would be allowed or if it would be replaced with a childrens Halloween Party.

Gladys Donley moved to go ahead with trick-or-treating on October 31, 1983, seconded by John Wyse. Roll call vote: Mike Despones, Yea; John Harbal, Yea; Gladys Donley, Yea; Bill Peloquin, Yea; John Wyse, Yea; Barry Morrison, Absent. Five (5) Yeas, no (0) Nays, one (1) Absent, the motion passed.

Ordinance No. 33-83 was presented for the third reading, by title only. Gladys Donley moved to pass Ordinance No. 33-83. A total deposit of \$100.00 must be paid by the property owners to cover the cost of closing prior to the first advertisement. Any monies in excess of the cost of advertisement will be refunded to the property owners. Any additional cost to the \$100.00 deposit must be paid before the closing is recorded at the Court House in Port Clinton. The motion was seconded by Bill Peloquin. Roll call vote: \*Note: (Councilman Morrison arrived at 8:45 P.M.) Bill Peloquin, Yea; Mike Despones, Yea; John Harbal, Yea; John Wyse, Yea; Gladys Donley, Yea; Barry Morrison, Yea. Six (6) Yeas, no (0) Nays, the motion passed.

Mike Despones moved to omit from Ordinance No. 34-83, Section #5, providing for a third full-time police officer in the police department. There was no second to the motion. The motion died for lack of a second.

Ordinance No. 34-83 was read by title only, for the second reading, by Barry Morrison.

Jeff Weise was present at Council to discuss several items. Mr. Weise resides at 104 Washington Street and is protesting the "Turn On - Turn Off" charges by the Utility Department. He also wanted to file a complaint against Village Administrator, Clarence Muggy, and would like a refund of \$25.00 for the amove mentioned fee. He would also like an explanation as to why the village does does not provide the citizens with 24 hour police protection. He has had his home vandalized.

Barry Morrison moved to reimburse Mr. Weise, due to the unusual circumstances involved in his being charged the turn on-turn off fee. The motion was seconded by Gladys Donley. Roll call vote: Barry Morrison, Yea; John Wyse, Nay; Bill Peloquin, Nay; Gladys Donley, Yea; John Harbal, Nay; Mike Despones, Nay. Two (2) Yeas, four (4) Nays, the motion did not pass. This matter will be turned over to the Utilities Committee and discussed at the next Council Meeting.

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John Wyse is getting estimates on fans for the Council Chambers.

There will be a Zoning Meeting pertaining to the splitting of lots for the nursing home.

Bill Peloquin moved to adjourn. The meeting was adjourned at 9:30 P.M.
