Minutes of Genoa Village Council

Meeting

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National Graphics Corp., Col., O. Form No. 1097

Held Council Chambers ..... 7:30 P.M. .... August 5, ..... 1985.

Mayor Michael Despones called the regular council meeting to order with the pledge to the Flag. Clerk-Treasurer Barbara Smith called the roll: Bower, present, Klee, present, Donley, present, Harbal, present, Peloquin, present, Hosley, absent.

Minutes from the July 15, 1985 meeting having been furnished to Council. Bower moved, Harbal seconded, that they be approved as presented. Roll Call Vote: Yeas; Bower, Klee, Harbal, Donley, and Peloquin. (5) Nays; None.

Mr. Klee moved, and Mrs. Donley seconded, to approve payment of the bills as presented. Roll Call Vote: Yeas; Klee, Bower, Harbal, Donley, and Peloquin. (5). Nays; None.

Mr. Peloquin read ORDINANCE 14-85, AN ORDINANCE PROVIDING FOR A FOUR WAY STOP AT 5th. AND WEST STREETS IN THE VILLAGE, for the third reading in full. Mr. Harbal, moved to pass Ordinance 14-85, motion seconded by Bower. Mr. Peloquin recommended that the ordinance not be passed, and that the Street Department, clean up the corners of bushes and trees in the right of way, that the situation would be alleviated. Roll Call Vote: Yeas; None. Nays; Klee, Bower, Harbal, Donley, and Peloquin. (5) Ordinance defeated.

Peloquin presented ORDINANCE 15-85, ESTABLISHING A PERMANENT STOP LIGHT AT MAIN STREET AND 12th. STREET IN THE VILLAGE BETWEEN THE HOURS OF 7:00 A.M. AND 11:00 P.M. Mr. Klee moved that the rule requiring ordinances to be fully and distinctly read on three different days be dispensed with, in accordance with Sec. 731.17, Ohio Revised Code. Harbal, seconded the motion. Roll Call Vote: Yeas; Donley, Peloquin, Harbal, Klee, Bower. (5) Nays: None. The Ordinance was then read the first and second times by title only by Mr. Peloquin. The Ordinance was then read the third time, in full, by Mr. Peloquin. Mr. Klee moved that the Ordinance 15-85 be passed as an emergency measure. Mr. Bower seconded the motion. Roll Call Vote: Yeas; Klee, Bower, Harbal, Donley, and Peloquin. (5) Nays; None. Mr. Bower, moved that Ordinance 15-85, be passed, seconded by Mrs. Donley. Roll Call Vote: Yeas; Peloquin, Donley, Harbal, Klee, and Bower. (5) Nays; None. Ordinance passed.

Mr. Fredrick Baldwin, door to door salesman for Southwestern Education Volumes, requested to peddle in the village. Mr. Peloquin, cited the Green River Ordinance which does not allow to issue individual permits. Request denied.

A Reverend John Harris, has requested permission to set up a tent in Veterans Park, to hold a week long revival meetings. Mr. Klee moved, that permission be denied, seconded by Mr. Bower. Roll Call Vote: Yeas; Bower, Klee, Harbal, Peloquin, and Donley. (5) Nays; None. Motion passed.

Committee Reports-

AdHoc-None

Finance-Norman Klee brought up the matter of Fines & Penalties, with regards to 1984 delinquent reports. Mayor Despones disapproved reporting at that time. Mr. Klee moved to appeal the decision of the chair. The chair would not relinquish the decision. At 8:10 P.M. Mr. Klee left the meeting without permission. Mr. Klee, stated that he left because the chair was out of order.

Safety-Mr. Bower, stated that the last stages of investigating for an

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additional patrolman are being made.

Insurance-Mrs. Donley, read a letter from Ohio State Life, stating there would be no rate increase in September.

Board Reports-

Park-Mayor Despones reported, Sgt. Winterfield of Ohio Air National Guard Unit, will begin work on the Veterans Park Ballfield, this coming weekend.

Zoning-The Walter Drane Company, is to begin publishing the Codified Ordinances.

Department Heads-

Street-Jerry Neff, reported the voting booths are in bad shape, and requested we look into new ones. The Clerk is to call and get a price. Mr. Peloquin, has called The Davey Tree Company, concerning the tree removal.

There being no further business, Mayor Despones, asked for adjournment.
