In the absence of Mayor Michael Despones and Joe Verkin Council-Pres. Genoa Village Council meeting was called to order by the Clerk-Treasurer Barbara Smith with the pledge to the flag.

Roll call as follows: Harbal, present, Donley present, Skilliter present, Bower absent, Verkin absent, and Miller present. (4) present.

Donley moved and Skilliter seconded to approve the minutes of the September 21, meeting as presented. Roll call vote: Harbal yea, Donley yea, Skilliter yea and Miller yea. (4) Nays None.

Zoning: Mark Mulligan has continued the zoning hearing until October 19, 1987 at 8:00 pm.

Mayors report: Mayor Despones has requested a special council meeting on October 12, 1987 at 7:00 pm to interview the final two candidates for Administrator.

Angelo Derrick was present and requested he be given decision results on the camera inspection of the sewer line. Miller stated that the Utilities Committee will be meeting on October 12th after the special meeting.

Additionally Mr. Derrick wished to discuss fines for junk in yards and the time frame thereof, rats along packer creek and the two street lights at 13th and Main.

Tom Lee, wished to discuss the cracks and lack of maintenance of the tennis court, also inquired as to why the tennis courts are not lighted at night.

Committee reports:

Streets- The bids have been open today for the purchase of the dump truck for the street department. Jerry Neff and the Street Committee will study the bids and make a recommendation.

ADHoc: Skilliter reported on a meeting with Mrs. Bergman concerning the Town Hall Parking Lot and cleaning of Packer Creek. He stated it has been stressed that the cost, time frame and the grading around conrail tracks were concerns. Another meeting will be held on Saturday October 10, at 11:30 and Mrs. Bergman is to bring estimates on the cost.

Economic Development: Meeting will be Wednesday October 14, 7:30 pm

Insurance - Mrs. Smith reported the renewal of the Property, Casualty and Liability Insurance being advertized for renewal on November 10, 1987.

Skilliter read Ordinance 59-87 for the Second reading.

Mrs. Donley reported on dog owners allowing their dogs to use Camper school yard to relieve themselves.

Mrs. Donley has received a letter from the Bowling Green office of the State Humane Society, in response to an inquiry of Mrs. Bankhurst's concern over an Animal control ordinance.

Concerns were expressed over the response time on calls of a peeping tom.

Mrs. Donley questioned the reasons for not parking the extra police car behind the police station.

There being no further business the meeting was adjourned.
