Mayor Michael Despones called the special council meeting to order with the pledge to the flag.

Clerk/Treasurer Barbara Smith called the roll as follows: Bower, Verkin, Harbal, Donley, Skilliter and Miller present. (6)

Minutes from the December 21, 1987 meeting amended as follows; Page 193 Robert Skilliter added to names of signatures of council signing Income Tax Department Statement. Donley moved and Bower seconded to approve the minutes as amended. Roll call vote as follows: Bower, Verkin, Harbal, Donley Skilliter and Miller Yes.(6) Nays. None. Passed.

Mayor Despones appointed Bruce Moritz as Fire Chief. Verkin moved and Harbal seconded to approve the appointment of Bruce Moritz as Fire Chief. Roll call vote: Yeas: Bower, Verkin, Harbal, Donley, Skilliter and Miller. (6) Passed.

Verkin read Ordinance 87-87 for the Third Reading. Verkin moved and Miller seconded to pass Ordinance 87-87 An Ordinance Creating a Second Full-time position of police patrolman and setting the wage therefore. Roll call vote. Yeas, Miller, Skilliter, Donley, Harbal, Verkin, and Bower. (6) Nays. Passed.

Skilliter read Ordinance 90-87 for the second reading.
Skilliter read Ordinance 91-87 for the second reading.

Zoning - Harold Wepler informed that the owners of the building rented by the Yankee Pedlar, the Oddfellows, have requested to install a sign on the existing post. The old sign has been gone for sometime and the pole presents an obstruction on the right-of-way. Donley moved and Harbal seconded to direct the Village Street Department to remove the post. Mayor Despones suggested that Oddfellows apply to the zoning board. The Zoning Board could then make a decision whether to turn them down or not. They could appeal if a negative decision was given. Skilliter suggested it is the responsibility of the owners of the building to remove the post in the right-of-way at their expense. Donley and Harbal withdrew their motion and second.

Tony Pietrowski stated he wants an investigation of the Police Department.

Donley read a letter from Lane Drug Company in response to her inquiry regarding their hiring of Village residents and their use of services from Village businesses. They stated names and numbers of employees from the Village and the businesses they had used for services, etc.

There being no further business the meeting was adjourned.
